

# Oliver Named Adviser To President of Korea

Dr. Robert T. Oliver, professor and head of the department of speech at the College, has been named as adviser to Dr. Syngman Rhee, president of the Republic of Korea, and departed last month for the Far East. He will return in February.

In his new position, Dr. Oliver expects to deal with Korean-Japanese and Korean-American problems. Two of the problems with which the Republic of Korea government now is concerned are the question of whether or not the 38th parallel would continue to be a boundary or would there be complete unification and independence of all Korea if hostilities cease and should arms be provided for an additional 200,000 Korean troops?

Prior to joining the Penn State faculty in 1949, Dr. Oliver was manager of the Washington bureau of the Korean Pacific Press and now serves as consultant to the Korean Pacific Press. From 1942 to 1948, he served as counselor to the Korean Commission which was the diplomatic agency of the Republic of Korea in exile and was dissolved in 1948 when the Republic was established.

He served on the faculty of the University of Korea in Seoul in 1946 and last September published the book, "Why War Came in Korea." He also has written other books and numerous magazine articles on Korea.

Accompanied by his family, Dr. Oliver sailed from San Francisco on June 23. His family will take up residence in Tokyo.
