

# Athletic Groups To Consider Ban

Both the Eastern College Athletic conference and the National Collegiate Athletic association will be asked to consider the Penn State athletic advisory board's suggestion that Spring football practice and the platoon system be eliminated as injurious to "the general health of college athletics."

Dr. Carl P. Schott, dean of the School of Physical Education and Athletics and ex-officio member of the board, said he planned to address a request for such consideration to Earl R. Yoemans, of Temple University, executive chairman of ECAC, and Hugh C. Willett, of Southern California, president of NCAA.

Penn State's advisory board, a 13-man group representing students, faculty, alumni and trustees, advanced these proposals in a report which considers both developments detrimental to the future of college football. While the financial aspects were stressed in each case, the board also expressed the opinion that the over-emphasis engendered by Spring practice contributes to the academic delinquency of athletes. Factors other than finances and academic deterioration cited by the board to strengthen its argument against the continuance of Spring practice were the loss of enthusiasm for the game which

sometimes results from over-emphasis; and the ban it involuntarily imposes on football players who might like to participate in other Spring sports. Less than a month ago, the College dropped five minor sports from its intercollegiate program as an economy measure.

# Ted Roderer, Owen Landon In Tourneys

Penn State's Owen Landon and Ted Roderer were the College's representatives in post-season championship meets.

Landon, entered in the Eastern Intercollegiate Athletic association tennis tournament in Syracuse, N.Y., bowed to Bill Lusk of Colgate in the semi-finals. Before Landon was defeated, he managed to upset top-seeded Ronnie Ryan of Colgate.

Roderer, the lone State entry in the National Collegiate Athletic association track meet in Seattle, Wash., took fifth place in the javelin throw with a heave of 208 feet.

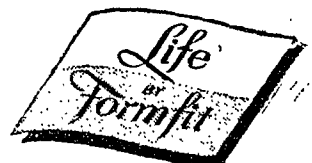
