College Naval ROTC Cadets Participate In Training Program

The College will be represented in the Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps program for midshipmen to be held at Little Creek, Va., tomorrow.

Training for the midshipmen, who are known as NARMID-51 (Naval Reserve Midshipmen 1951), will consist of instruction afloat in ships of the Naval Amphibious Force, U. S. Atlantic Fleet, and classes ashore the Naval Amphibious Base.

The training will last for three weeks with special emphasis on craft work such as basic boat handling and gunfire support in an amphibious operation.

In addition to the amphibious training at Little Creek, the NROTC student officers will receive a week of aviation indoctrination training at the Naval Air Station, Pensacola, Fla.
