

Town Militia Blasts Bad Birds Brutally

The second "Summer Offensive" against the 'Starling Invaders' was made Monday night by the State College militia.

Late reports from the front told of heavy actions at eight key points where the screaming birds were blasted from their treetop points of concentration.

Casualty lists were not complete after the second assault led by Police Chief John Juba, but indications were that the list may even be larger than the 300 killed in the first big blast last week.

Army of Forty

Forty persons, armed with shot-guns and supplied with ammunition by the local constabulary, participated in the initial attack, which took devastating toll of the noisy birds ranks. 300 birds were reported killed. The militia reported no casualties.

Plans formulated by the State College borough manager call for repeated attacks on the starlings to prevent any "buildup" for future invasion.

Attack Tactics

The tactical plans of Chief Juba and his 40 "bird-blasters" are blasts into the roosts of the birds which are repeated each time the starlings return.

The birds best evasive tactic is a feigned flight from the bad shot-up roosts. In a body the starlings fly down the street, around the block and back to the original shooting point.

Godshall Offered Post On Columbia Ed. Project

William F. Godshall, supervising principal of the Juniata Valley Joint Schools, treasurer of the Pennsylvania School Study Council, and a graduate student at the College, has been invited to join the staff of the Citizenship Education Project at Columbia University.

Sponsored by the Carnegie Corporation and operated through Teachers College at Columbia, the program is directed by Dr. William S. Vincent, formerly professor of education at Penn State. Godshall will join the field staff of the project, centering in New York, but with area contacts covering higher institutions in several states.

Last Day For Vets To Begin Training

Today is the last day for veterans discharged from service prior to July 25, 1947, to begin educational training, according to the Veterans Administration.

Those who were enrolled for the Spring semester will be eligible to continue their studies in the Fall under the GI program provided they did not complete their training. Others must be enrolled in a program on or before July 25, 1951 and the program must consist of at least five weeks of work in order that they may maintain their eligibility under the GI program.

Work Injuries Pamphlet Published By Alice Warn

"Work Injuries Compensable in Pennsylvania" is the subject of a pamphlet by Alice Warn, research assistant in the Bureau of Business Research at the Pennsylvania State College.

The study, just published, analyzes the Pennsylvania Compensation laws and classifies rights and obligations that will aid employer and employee to determine when a mishap is a compensable injury, what benefits may be secured therefore, and how to go about obtaining them.

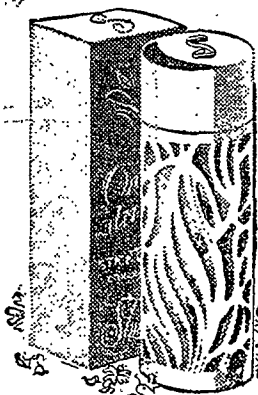
