

# X-Country, Wrestling Post Perfect Record

Penn State's 1950-51 sports season was highlighted by perfect records in cross-country and wrestling and the good-will trip to Iran by Bill Jeffrey's soccer team.

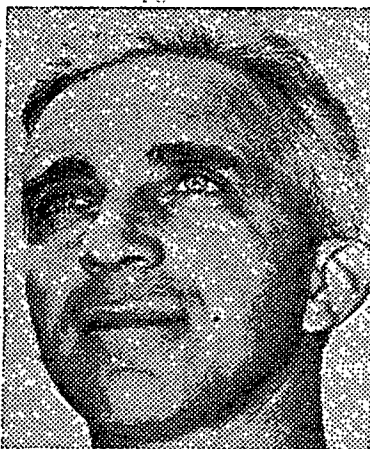
Charlie Speidel's wrestler, unbeaten in eight dual meets, won the Eastern intercollegiate team title for the first time since 1942 as Chick Werner's cross-country team carried off top honors in IC-4A and NCAA competition. The harriers were unbeaten in five meets.

The Lion soccer team, winner in eight out of nine games during the regular season, triumphed over the Purdue Soccer Club in the post-season Soccer Bowl at St. Louis, Mo., before heading for Iran at the State Department's request to play a series of games in that country.

Baseball's 10-3 record, basketball's 14-9 log, and a 9-4 rating in tennis enabled Penn State teams

to compile an over-all mark of 117 wins, 65 defeats, and 2 ties during the 1950-51 sports season.

Football came up with a 5-3-1 log in its first season under a new coach, Rip Engle, formerly of Brown, while golf and lacrosse both finished with 6-3 records.

# Gridders Face 3 Mid-Western Teams In Fall

For the first time in modern Penn State football history, the Nittany Lions will oppose three midwestern teams in 1951. The three are Michigan State, Purdue and the University of Nebraska.

The Nebraska game, at Lincoln, will be the third in a series of four while the Michigan State game resumes a rivalry interrupted twice in the last six years.

Only newcomer on the schedule, other than Purdue, will be Boston University. Buff Donelli's up-and-coming eleven will oppose the Nittany Lions at State College in the opening game Sept. 29th.

Retained from the 1950 card, which saw the Lions win five, lose three, and tie one, are Syracuse, West Virginia, Rutgers and Pittsburgh. Villanova will return after a one-year lapse, and this game will be played at Allentown, in Allentown High School's handsome new stadium.

The 1951 schedule will mark the fifth year in a row that the Nittany Lions will have played nine rather than the once-traditional eight games.

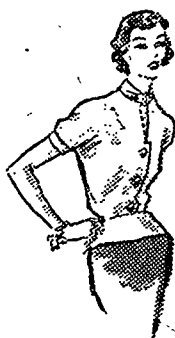
