

Ground Broken for New Hillel

Representatives of the College and student body spoke at the ground breaking ceremonies of the new B'nai B'rith Foundation Sunday afternoon at Highland avenue and Locust lane.

'Builds Character'—Morse
Rabbi Benjamin Kahn, foundation director, traced the history of the foundation since its establishment in 1935. He pointed out the double role of Hillel as one of the contributing agencies to the deepening of the religious and ethical preceptions of the students and is a vehicle for the transmission of the Jewish cultural and religious heritage to successive generations of students.

In his greetings, A. O. Morse, provost, spoke of the importance of the Hillel Foundation as a character-building agency and as a necessary supplement to the studies in the classroom.

Spring Dedication Set
William M. Gerber, vice-president of the Supreme Lodge of B'nai B'rith, was the principal speaker. He pointed out that the new Hillel house is one of 24 being built among the more than 204 foundations in the United States, Canada, and Israel.

The new house is being erected by the combined efforts of the

B'nai B'rith lodges in Pennsylvania. It will be dedicated in the spring and used in the fall as a center for religious, cultural, and social activities for the Jewish students and it will also be open for the general student body and campus community.

Second DP Arrives

Wsevolod Arefjev, second person brought to the campus by the displaced persons committee, arrived from the Ukraine Sunday night.

The committee shortened his first name to Seva. He will work at the Nittany Lion Inn this year and then attend school.

The displaced persons committee plans to bring 11 displaced persons to State College.

All new students will be given an opportunity to join the Community Concert Association this year, Dr. F. R. Matson, president said today.

Artists for the program are booked in accordance with the budget made possible by the number of memberships sold.

This year's drive will open Monday, Oct. 8, and no tickets will be sold after the drive closes.

Charter members of the association will be given an opportunity to renew their memberships. Vacancies created by persons leaving the campus may be filled by new students or persons unable to purchase tickets last year.

Dr. Matson pointed out that the number of tickets sold is limited by the capacity of Schwab Auditorium.

break pledges may not pledge another fraternity for 30 days. This ruling does not apply to pledgeships dissolved by the fraternity.

Although a student may pledge only one fraternity, he may be rushed by any number. Rushing is followed by a pledgeship period, providing the student receives a bid and accepts. Pledgeship, normally lasting a semester, is terminated at the initiation when the pledge becomes a brother.

IFC, governing body of Penn State fraternities, and the organization enforcing rushing regulations, consists of representatives from each fraternity.
