The teams will be mixed, with Taverne from Oxford and George from Penn State taking the affirmative. Rees-Mogg of Oxford and David Lewis of Penn State will argue the negative.

The non-decision debate is open to all. There is no admission fee.

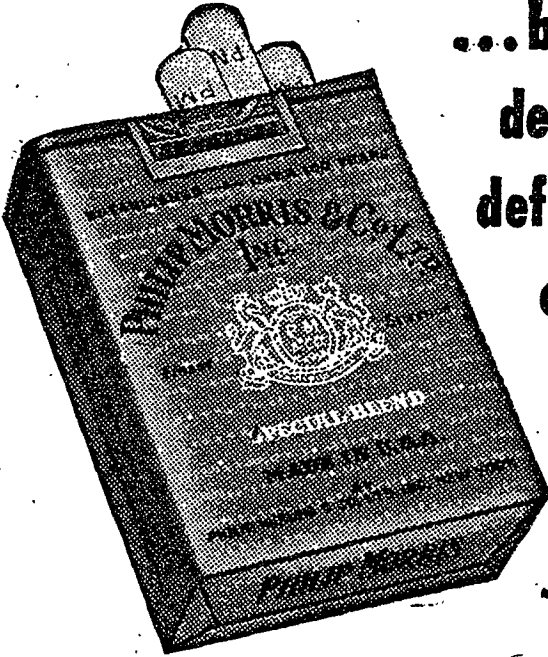
