

# Nittany Runners Seek 8th Straight **Dual Meet Win Against Cornell Today**

This Bobby Reynolds of Nebraska is some football player. Just take a look at the records.

Last season, his sophomore year, Reynolds carried the ball 1342 Big Red Hopeful yards to break the Big Sèven Conference record, averaging 6.9 yards per carry, second best average in the country.

The flashy Nebraskan scored 2 touchdowns, and kicked 25 points after touchdown for a total of 157 points and a new scoring record. He completed four of ten passes for 75 yards and caught 11 for 173 yards. Also a punter, Reynolds aver-aged 37.7 yards per kick. A real stop-and-go runner, Rey-
