

# Jeffrey Makes 2 Changes For Game at Annapolis

Two changes will be made in Penn State's starting lineup when Coach Bill Jeffrey's soccer team takes the field against Navy today at Annapolis.

The contest is slated for 2 p.m.

Freshman Charlie Snyder, former Mercersburg Academy star, will start at left wing instead of Hap Irvin. Snyder receives the nod over John Carroll, another freshman, who hails from Harry Little's hometown of Dover. Thus far, Jeffrey has found the outside left position troublesome. Snyder saw some action against Bucknell and Army.

### Goalie Undecided

Another modification in State's starting eleven will be at the goalie spot where either Bob Harris or Jack Krumrine will replace Dick Cheskis, who opened in the Army fray. Harris and Krumrine are both sophomores.

Outside of these two positions, the Lions will have the same lineup that lost, 4-1, to Army.

Along the front line, Jeffrey will use Captain Ron Coleman at inside left. Coleman has done the lion's share of the offensive work. In two matches, Coleman has scored four of Penn State's six goals, including the lone tally against Army.

At center forward, Ellis

Kocher, who has scored the other two Penn State scores, will start, with Don Shirk in reserve.

Handling the right side of the forward wall will be Jack Pinezich, inside right, and Bill Norcik, outside right. Pinezich's status is doubtful because of a back injury, but it is expected that he will be ready in time for Navy. Norcik came out of the Army contest in good condition and is improving with every game.

In the backfield, the Lions will send the same five men against the Midshipmen. Three of these, Frank Follmer, Kurt Klaus, and Jack Charlton have been playing together since high school.

### Tough on Defense

Follmer is expected to take over where he left off against Bucknell. In the Bison match, he was the most outstanding defensive player on the field. Klaus and Charlton, who haven't shown too much this year, will have to

Jay Simmons and Paul Dierks will play the fullback posts with Simmons opening on the left side and Dierks on the right.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 19 — (AP)—Pro Football Commissioner Bert Bell today ruled that Heartley (Hunk) Anderson could not sign as head coach of the Washington Redskins. The Redskins promptly gave the job to Dick Todd, former Texas A and M star.

Todd succeeds Herman Ball, who had been head man since the middle of the 1949 season.

Todd had been one of his assistants.

Ball will stay on with the Redskin organization in the same job he had when he started with them—as a scout.

The announcement of the developments came from Redskin General Manager Dick McCann.
