

# King of the Mardi Gras To Be Crowned Tonight

Arabian dancers, spooks, freaks, and chorus girls will be among the entertainers at the Mardi Gras carnival from 8 to 12 midnight tonight in Recreation Hall.

A highlight of the carnival will be the crowning of the King of the Mardi Gras. Nancy McClain, president of Mortar Board, sponsors of the carnival, will crown the king with a mortar board. He will be presented with a silver scepter, a certificate of kingship, and a complimentary gift certificate from Jack Harper's.

### Pictures on Display

Marilyn Williams will play the fanfare. The crown-bearer will be the president of the organization whose candidate is king. Lois Pulver and Constance Melvin will be jesters.

Nineteen candidates have been nominated for king honors. Their pictures are on display in the window of the Athletic Store. Voting at one penny a vote will close at 11 tonight, and the crowning ceremony will take place at 11:30 tonight.

### Free Dancing

Twenty booths, sponsored by 18 sororities, Leonides, and freshman council, will compete for possession of a bronze trophy cup, awarded to the booth which takes in the largest number of tickets.

Admission to the carnival will be 15 cents. Tickets priced at ten cents will be sold at the door, and will be good at all booths. Dancing will be free of charge.

Mortar-Board will run a refreshment stand. Cider will cost one ticket, and a second ticket will be good for two doughnuts.

### Alpha Phi Omega to Help

Proceeds from the carnival will be given to the Charlotte E. Ray Memorial Scholarship Fund, income from which is used for scholarships for worthy women on campus.

Members of Alpha Phi Omega, service honorary, will be on hand at 5 p.m. today to help with booth construction. Each group sponsoring a booth will furnish its own props.

### Heims King Last Year

Miss McClain announced that booths will close at 11:30 tonight. Booth chairmen have been asked to make an approximate count of their tickets before turning them in at the ticket booth between 11:30 and 11:45 tonight. The winning organization will be announced in Tuesday's Daily Collegian.

Proceeds from last year's Mardi Gras totaled \$1139.69. This amount was almost \$400 more than the previous year's total. For the past two years, the trophy has been won by Alpha Omicron Pi. Kappa Delta placed second last year.

Patrick Heims was last year's king. He is a member of Phi Kappa Tau and was sponsored by Alpha Omicron Pi.

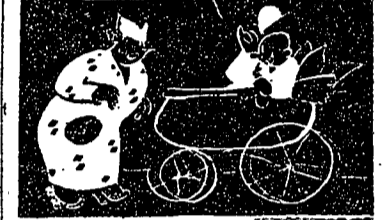
