Marvin Krasnansky, Daily Collegian editor, in asking for postponement, said more time was needed to investigate "many complications that have set in."

'President Day' Rejected

Cabinet passed a motion by Harry Cover, All-College vice president, to have Marilyn Levitt, Panhellenic Council president, submit a report on the sorority house problem. He said in order to end the recent rumors on campus concerning the situation a report should be made public for all concerned.

The group turned down a recommendation by Ronald Bonn, Froth editor, to have cabinet co-sponsor with Froth a "president for a day" program by a 17 to 2 vote. There was one abstention.

Bonn asked that, if President Milton S. Eisenhower would give his approval, a student selected from a letterwriting contest would become president of the College for one day.

It was indicated that the President would not approve the plan if promotion of Froth was the main idea, but if it would advance student government he would "consider it very closely."

James Worth, All-College president, appointed Richard Lemyre sophomore representative and Walter Sachs junior representative to Tribunal. The appointments were made to fill the positions created by an amendment to the Constitution which was passed by cabinet last week.

Behind the mental and physical torture is the desire to break one's will so that the prisoner will say what the Communists want him to say, Vogeler said. "Faith is shattered against the walls of futility built up in the prisoner's imagination", he continued, and the prisoner signs the "rubbish" placed before him because he cannot stand any more of the degradation and brutality.

Vogeler said that no real evidence of guilt was ever presented, because no evidence ever

existed. "I played a stellar role in a gigantic public fraud."

In a question period that followed the lecture, Vogeler said that he did not think that the loyalty oath would do anything to help preserve America's freedom.


