# **1st Semester Frosh Barred From Suites**

No first semester freshman woman will be permitted in any sorority suite at any time until the end of this semester according to Marilyn Levitt, president of Panhellenic Council.

Organized parties, hayrides, slumber parties, or other affairs sponsored by a sorority or by any of its members are also taboo

for these women, Miss Levitt said.

She also said penalties for ille-gal rushing will be meted out to any sorority disobeying the rulings.

#### Three Weeks Penalty

Social probation is used by the council as punishment for illegal rushing methods. Probation is a strict ruling preventing any social function or entertainment by

the sorority penalized. Three weeks of social proba-tion is the penalty for the first rushing infraction: six weeks for rushing infraction; six weeks for the second offense; and social probation for a complete semester, for the third offense.

A sorority will be reported in the following manner:

1. One signed and one unsigned accusation will be given to the Panhellenic Judicial committee. The unsigned copy will be shown to the accused sorority, while the signed copy will be kept by the committee.

2. The accused sorority will be given a chance to present its case. 3. After the facts have been (Continued on page eight)


Ray Evert, Lion Party clique chairman, admitted accepting the gift, but said such a gift was done at no expense to anybody and should not be counted in the budget.
