

Cornell Survey Bares Cheating

A recent poll conducted by the Cornell University Student Council revealed that 47 per cent of the school's students admitted cheating in examinations. The results may not be conclusive as they are based upon 322 students questioned out of 10,000 enrolled.

Of the students questioned ten per cent admitted cheating frequently or occasionally. An additional 37 per cent admitted cheating once or twice.

For purposes of the survey, cheating was defined to include cribbing, copying, giving and receiving aid, and discussing and using information about an exam which had been obtained illegally.

The council said that although 47 per cent of the students replying to the questionnaires admitted cheating, two-thirds of them disapproved of it. The students blamed the high cheating percentage on the emphasis given to grades not only at Cornell, but also at other large schools.

The council said the survey revealed that men and women were about equally guilty of cheating.

County Delight, bay four-year-old son of Count Fleet, will be coupled in the betting for the mile and three-sixteenths of the Maryland Jockey Club's glamor race with Royal Governor.

It is the only betting entry in the five-horse field. County Delight is owned by the Rokeby Stable of Paul Mellon, Pittsburgh financier and sportsman.

Reds Ask Line Of No Shooting

MUNSAN, Korea, Friday, Nov. 16—(AP)— Communist negotiators denied Thursday they sought a cease fire in Korea before the formal signing of an armistice, but continued to insist that the United Nations agree to a provisional stop-shooting line now.

The apparently paradoxical Communist stand was pointed up sharply in a United Nations communique Thursday night. It reported no progress Thursday in a three hour 20-minute subcommittee session at Panmunjom.

However the subcommittee delegates scheduled their 23rd meeting at Panmunjom for 11 a.m. today (9 p.m., Thursday, E.S.T.)
