For purposes of the survey cheating was defined to include cribbing, copying, giving and recesining information about an exam which had been obtained illegal ly.
The council said that although 47 per cent of the students replying to the questionnaires admitdisapproved of it. The students blamed the high cheating per-
centage on the emphasis given to also at other large schools.
