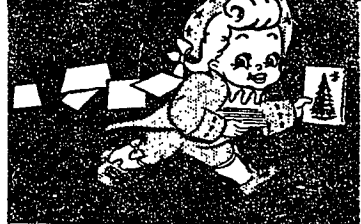
(Continued from page four) have become fewer and farther between, and we haven't let anybody copy anything since. Nobody seemed to want to, making our resolve easier to handle.
