Stage, Screen Males Define Ideal Woman

The ideal woman for both Marlon Brando and Yul Brynner, masterful stars of "A Streetcar Named Desire" and "The King and I," possesses "dignity, honesty, unselfishness, and love of other human beings," according to Helen Lawrenson's article, "Men for Christmas," appearing in the December Mademoiselle.

While spending a day with these two, Miss Lawrenson had an opportunity to sound them out on the kind of women they themselves prefer and to observe the effect they have on women.

"When we got into the elevator," she reports, "it was crowded with girls going to lunch. They took one gander at my escorts and all conversation stopped dead, sentences cut off in the middle as if by the guillotine... It was the same all along the street. Women did a double take and went limp."

She feels that the effect of Brando and Brynner is "nothing short of extraordinary," especially when one considers that in their famous roles to date "each has interpreted the human male animal in his more savage form." Brynner plays the Siamese despot in "The King and I," currently running on Broadway, and Brando was the lustful, bellowing Stanley in the movie version of "Streetcar."

Miss Lawrenson found that off stage both men bear little resemblance to their stage and screen portrayals. In real life each is intelligent, intensely sensitive, soft-spoken, and devoid of cruelty and bombast.
