## France Bids For British Participation

STRASBOURG, France, Dec. 10 Robert Schuman backed down from a strongly supra-national control of the proposed European

army-today in a bid for British participation.
He was backed by Belgian Foreign Minister Paul Van Zeeland who also urged a form of political control more likely to attrac British support. Bolt spoke to bly which has the form of an international parliament but no actual legislative powers.
At the recent meeting of At lantic Pact powers a plan for a European army which would be managed. by a European defense commissioner responsible to a council of ministers and an assem-
bly . chosen by the participating governments. The plan was designed to get German units lined up for defense of the West but to dilute political control by any one nation so that Germany would not again be a danger to Europe clared it would not join such an army because of the surrender of sovereignty involved, in the Schuman plan. Ratification of the plan may be difficult to obtain unless Britain decides to go in. Today the French Foreign Minister asked for a "modest, limited" political control. He said a small beginning would be better than no beginning, and that a high will operate the European steel and coal pool was not now prac tical for defense "where questions of peace or war and human 1
will be at stake."
