Truman Calls Meeting With Hoover, McGrath

NEW YORK, Dec. 12 - (AP) -Actress Tullulah Bankhead today was barred from the court room where her former maid-secretary Al Capone out of jail before his is on trial for alleged grand lar-

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12-(AP)-President Truman called Attorney General McGrath and FBI chief J. Edgar Hoover to the White House today, giving rise to new reports that he plans a major move to offset mounting tax scandals.

Speculation immediately arose that Mr. Truman might assign Hoover or some other nationally known figure to make a govern-ment-wide investigation. Hoover has been head of the FBI since 1924. He was appointed by President Coolidge.

Another possibility mentioned was that the President would set up a bi-partisan commission to conduct the inquiry, as Coolidge did in cracking down on the Tea-pot Dome oil-lease scandals of that era.


