### Traffic Survey Involves 5000 Automobiles

Nearly 5000 automobiles are involved in campus traffic and parking problems, according to the traffic census taken recently by the department of the physical plant.

Walter Wiegand, head of the department, conducted the survey to get more information for further study of College traffic. Wiegand said a committee has been named to carry on this study.

Of the 5000 cars, 2197 are student-owned, of which 933 belong to off-campus residents and 437 to commuters. Officials said these figures may vary about ten per cent because of indifference or misunderstanding of the purpose of the survey.
