The overtime was a foul-shooting battle with Colgate ahead at one point 61-57. State scored five successive tallies to move ahead again 63-61. Lalla made a foul, followed by Osborne's second important tap-in to clinch the game.

State made 21 of 30 foul attempts while Colgate connected with 19 of 26.

Two players left the game via personals—Williams of State and Al Antinelli of the Red Raiders. Weidenhammer was the best sharpshooter making four of six field goal attempts.

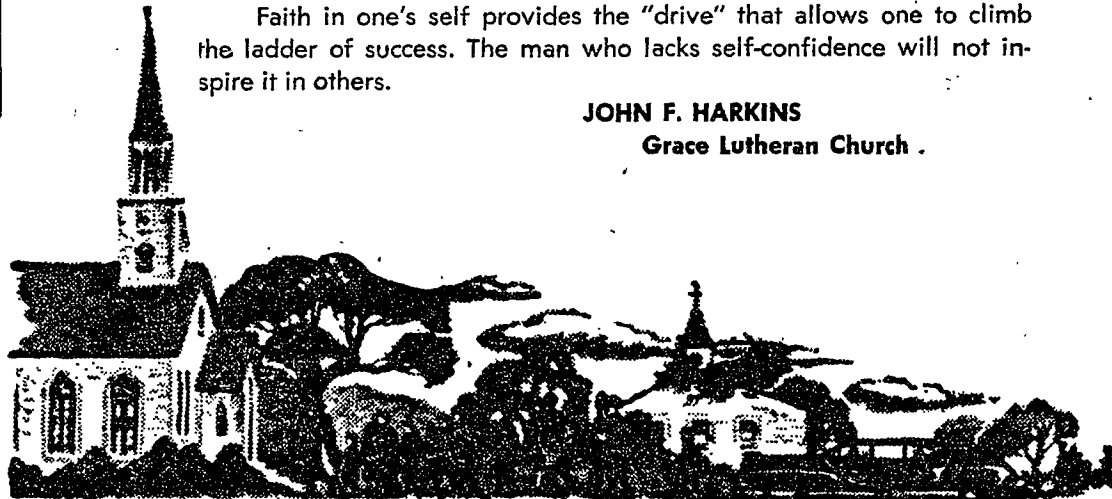
Faith is an essential in every successful life. Faith in God is a requisite to right living. Knowing God as our Creator and Benefactor buttresses man for the trials and temptations of life.
