"You should have seen the expression on Bender's face when he realized it was the first time in his life he had ever been in a plane," Boudreau added.

The plane landed in Philadelphia at 9:55. They hailed another cab and arrived at the Palestra during the half.

At the game they sat on the bench with the Penn team, next to the coach's son (who sat between them and the coach). There they sat, on the Penn side, cheering the Lions on. "We didn't know we were sitting on the Penn side until the game was nearly over," Boudreau said. "We just walked over and sat down."

With an eye for the future, they asked for a ride back to State College over the public address system.

"It's a sad commentary," Bender said, "but we got no offers."

After the game they turned their cards around to read: "Penn State please . . . it's mighty cold out" and got a ride to the edge of Philadelphia.

Exhausted, they asked for refuge at a Baptist theological seminary on Route One. "I gave them a hard luck story," Bender said, "and told them my friend had a bad back."

They rose at 5:30 a.m. and thumbed a ride to the turnpike. "A long black Cadillac pulled up," Bender said. "It was Russel E. Teague, state secretary of health. He said his son was up here and told us he was on his way to Harrisburg for a cabinet meeting with Governor Fine," he said.

Bender and Boudreau arrived back in State College at 3 p.m. The trip had cost them \$10.75.

Said Bender: "We'd do it again if we had to!"

hower's supreme military command.

The ministers agreed to spread a network of some 200 jet fighters and atom bomber bases along the 2000-mile front facing the Iron Curtain to the east. General Eisen-

hower is to get 40 divisions and 4000 aircraft by the end of this year and double that in two years.

They gave the green light to the formation of a six-nation European Defense Community (EDC) which would put West German troops in a one-uniform Army at the side of those from France, Belgium, the Netherlands, Italy, and Luxembourg.

system came in third in the list of six choices from which the senators were asked to choose.

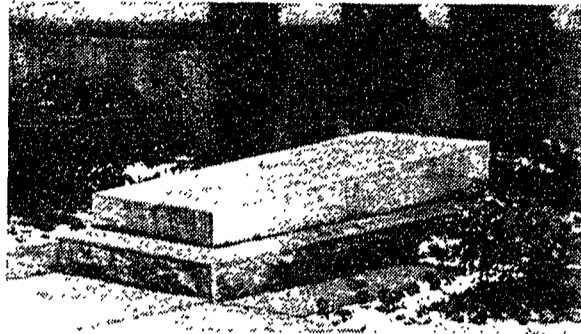
The calendar committee will meet either this week or next to wrestle with the results of the poll and come up with a plan to
