

Gymnasts Finish Dual Season Today at Temple

Penn State's gymnastics team will end its dual meet season at 2 this afternoon when the Lions meet Temple University in Philadelphia.

Coach Gene Wettstone's gymnasts will be trying for their fourth win of the season and third straight when they take on the Owls in Conway Hall. Temple has a 5-2 record for the year, having lost to Army and Navy.

Two Lions will attempt to keep perfect records intact in dual meet competition. Jan Cronstedt, unbeaten on the horizontal bar, and Bobby Lawrence, undefeated on the side-horse, will be strong favorites to continue their winning ways this afternoon.

Cronstedt's strongest competition is expected from Temple's No. 1 man, John Jengo. Backing Cronstedt on the high-bar will be Mario Todaro and Karl Schwenzfeier.

Frank Wick, Dick Shaffer, and Lawrence will be Wettstone's entries in the side-horse event.

Probably the closest competition of the afternoon will come on the flying rings where the Lions' Jim Hazen, beaten only once this season, will match exercises with the Owls' ace, John Galente. Last season in the NCAA tournament Galente finished second. Tony Procopio and Schwenzfeier will back Hazen as State's No. 2 and 3 men, respectively.

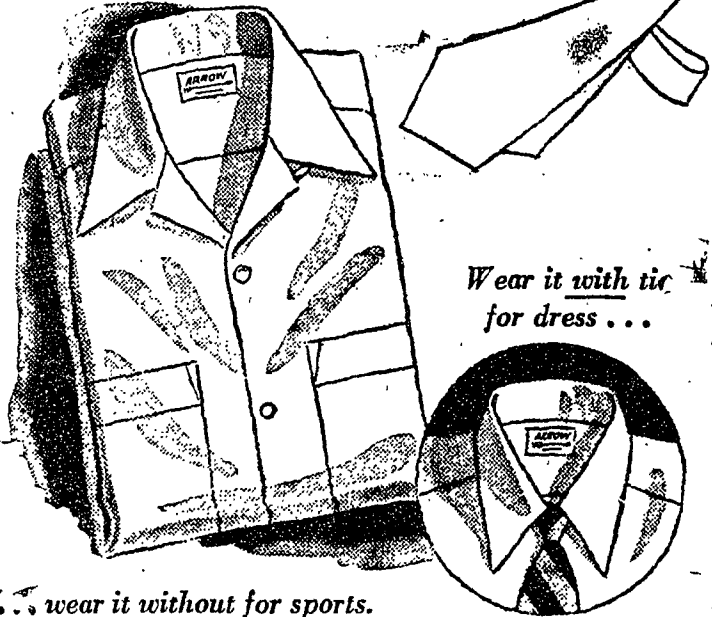
