

Students To Attend UN Session

The Penn State Christian Association, in cooperation with the Political Science department, will conduct a seminar at the United Nations headquarters March 27 to 30.

The seminar group will leave early on the morning of March 27. The program will include attending sessions of the UN assembly, interviews with UN delegates, and a visit to the headquarters of the United States mission to the UN.

Participants in the seminar will also attend sessions of the Economic and Social Council, the Trusteeship Council and the disarmament conference.

Among the UN leaders who will speak to the seminar group will be Ernest Gross, deputy at the UN headquarters and U.S. delegate to the UN; Charles Malik, Lebanon delegate to the UN; Otto Frey, secretary of the disarmament commission; Benjamin Cohen, U.S. delegate to the UN and representative on the disarmament commission; and Selwyn Lloyd, delegate from Great Britain to the UN.

Dr. John Ferguson of the Political Science department, who has recently returned from a tour of Europe, will head the seminar.

Students going on the trip will be excused from classes by the Dean of Men or the Dean of Women. The cost of the three-day seminar will be approximately \$30.

Students may sign up for the trip and pay the \$5 deposit in the PSCA office, 304 Old Main or the Political Science department office, 119 Sparks.
