# WSGA-WRA Primary Set For Tuesday

Primary voting will be held from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. Tuesday for the Women's Student Government Association and Women's Recreation Association elections.

All women living in dormitories will vote in their own buildings, except those living in Grange hall, who will vote in McAllister hall. Women living in home management houses, co-ops, and in town will vote in either Woman's Building or McAllister.

### Pictures on Display

Women may vote by giving their names, which will be checked off a master list.

Posters with pictures of all candidates will be displayed at the polls. Officers to be elected are WSGA president, vice president, treasurer, senior senator, junior senator, sophomore senator, and town senator, and WRA president, vice president, secretary-treasurer, intramural chairman, and assistant intramural chairman.

### All Eligible to Vote

Primary elections will limit the number running for each office to two. Final elections will be held Thursday.

All women students are eligible to vote for WSGA president, vice president, treasurer, and all WRA offices. In addition, juniors vote for senior senator, sophomores vote for junior senator, freshmen for sophomore senator, and town girls for town senator.

Since only two women are running for the office of town senator, these candidates will not be voted on in the primary.
