The brilliant lights went from luminous bands shooting out of the north to a point where they extended from horizon to horizon for half an hour.

The display was brighter than usual, but lacked the pastel colors so often connected with the phenomenon.

The northern lights are thought to be caused by the disturbance of atoms in the upper atmosphere.
