

# Fine Sees Two GOP Candidates

HARRISBURG, April 25—(AP)—Gov. John S. Fine said today the Republican presidential race has narrowed down to Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower and Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio.

Fine emphasized, however, the returns of Pennsylvania's presidential preference primary on Tuesday have not changed the position of the state's uninstruced 70-man delegation to the GOP national convention next July 7.

"Primaries, of course, have significance," he said. "Whatever significance ours has will be considered by the delegation, together with many other factors, in reaching its position on presidential candidacies."

The delegation will meet at Philadelphia May 24 in conjunction with a meeting of the Republican state committee. Fine, as governor, will head the delegation at the Chicago convention.

# Quaker to Discuss Religion, Culture

"Oriental Religion and Western Culture" will be the topic of Dr. Howard H. Brinton, director of Pendle Hill, a Quaker graduate school, at a public lecture at 8 p.m. tomorrow in 121 Sparks.

The lecture is sponsored by the Penn State Christian Association and the State College Friends Meeting.

Dr. Brinton is a student of philosophy and science and has written several books on religion including the theory and practice of Quakerism. He has traveled in Europe and the Far East.

As director of Pendle Hill he is taking part in an educational experiment to develop the spirit, mind, and body of the individual through a cooperative program of worship, education, and operation of the school plant.

Sieg, who is also president of the state chamber of commerce, was honored at a dinner by the Penn State chapter of the American Society for Metals.

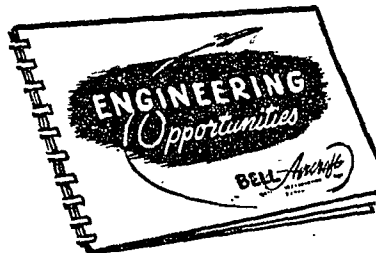

But while the audience is wondering about these minor defects, it is enjoying the play to the utmost.

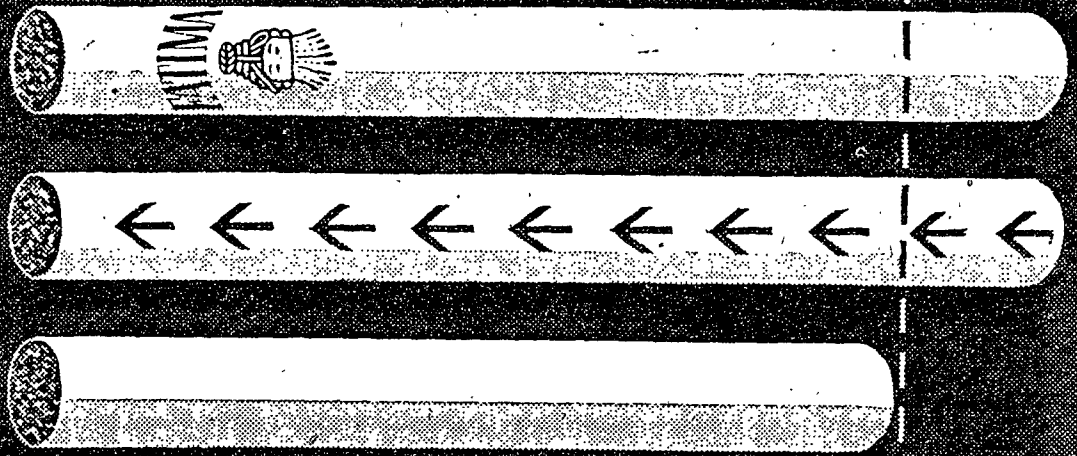
# Draft Quota for June
