Canterbury Club has discontinued its meetings for the remainder of this semester.

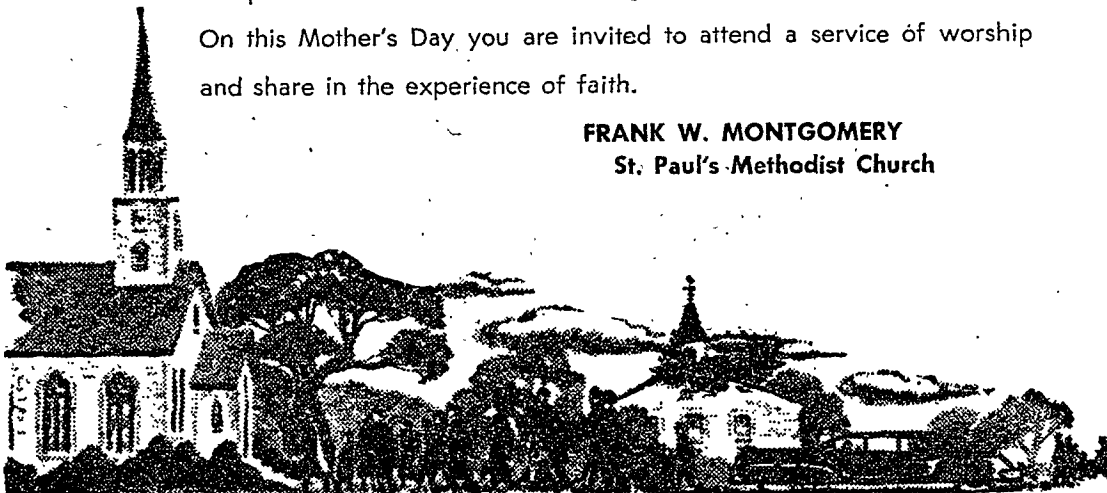
