ter at the College is one of the proposed campus projects. It would mean constructing a building or renting a house where foreign students at the College could live together. The funds could also be used for a center for activities fostering understanding between foreign students and American students with a planned program of social functions, lectures, and discussions.

A Chapel on the campus could be constructed for individual meditation, the use of small groups for services or worship, weddings and funerals, and meetings of religious organizations. It would be all-faith in nature and have a seating capacity of 75 to 100 with a meeting room and chaplain office. Other contributions would be sought, but construction would not be possible until a reasonable fund has accumulated.

A scholarship for a foreign student would amount to \$1000 to cover room, board, fees, and books for the student. Projects that would bring a student from one of the previously mentioned institutions for a year of study might be considered. With an additional allotment of money, travelling expenses could also be covered.
