Seniors Asked To Meet Near Pattee Library



Construction of the new \$1,-000,000 Chemistry Laboratory Building, behind Walker Laboratory, which has been held up be-cause of the lack of necessary materials, is now progressing

The proposed three story building, being made of Roman brick with limestone trimming, is designed to accommodate 3600 undergraduates. The building will be 100 feet by 220 feet.

The contract is held by S. H. Evert of Bloomsburg. The contract is for \$1,665,865, part of a large contract—including the wing on Pond Laboratory, the Chemical Storage building, and the Chemistry Laboratory building.
