

40 to Try Out For College Debate Teams

Approximately 20 men and 20 women will try out for the men's and women's debate squads next week. Men's tryouts are scheduled for 7 p.m. Wednesday in 316 Sparks and women's for 7 p.m. Thursday in 2 Sparks.

Five freshmen and 15 upperclassmen signed to try out for the men's team. Only upperclass women are required to try out; freshman women need only show interest to be automatically placed on the squad.

Both men and women candidates must present a five minute speech on the national intercollegiate debate topic, Resolved: That the Congress of the U.S. should enact a compulsory fair employment practices' law.

The first meeting for the freshmen who signed up for women's debate will be 7 p.m. Wednesday in 2 Sparks.

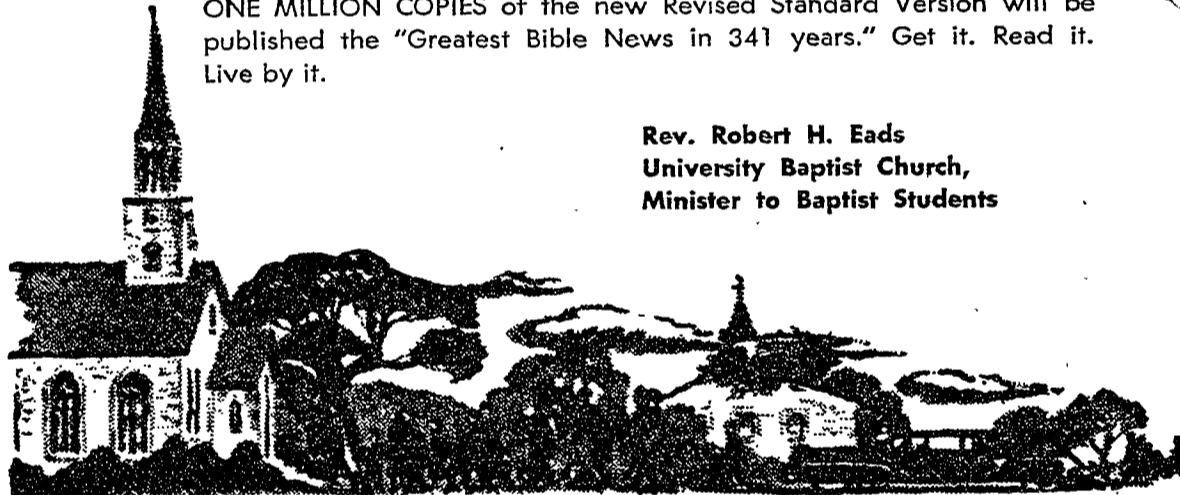
