(Continued from page one) book that would meet standards the 1953 class has a right to expect.

The decreased upperclass enrollment also results in a decreased order for yearbooks, and this increases the price per book. In 1950 there were 3625 copies produced at \$10.19 per book. Last year, 2750 copies were produced at \$11.73 per book.

Freshmen have not been assessed for the yearbook since 1950, when they paid \$1.25 per semester.

The unit cost of the LaVie per student would increase from \$12 to \$16. Backlog would not be charged to present sophomores, juniors, and seniors.

Woodrow Bierly, LaVie adviser, pointed out that since the only income for LaVie is student fees, this seems to be the only solution to meet present production costs.

In discussions on the floor of cabinet, Schoerke pointed out that the increase for this year's LaVie is not to elaborate on the yearbook, but merely to meet present production costs.

Since this recommendation involves a change in student fees it must be approved at two successive cabinet meetings before action can be taken. This is a clause in the All-College Cabinet Constitution, John Laubach, All-College president, said.

Essay Contest Offers Awards

A nation-wide essay contest dealing with "The United States and the Underdeveloped Areas" will be sponsored by the National Council of the Church of Christ in the U.S.A., with awards totaling \$1800.

The purpose of the contest, which opens Nov. 1, and closes at midnight, March 3, 1953, is to stimulate active interest in the problems of the Point Four Program and U.S. relationships with the economically underdeveloped countries of the world.

Requirements are that applicants be Americans between the ages of 15 and 23, and that essays be kept to 1000 words or less.

In addition to the first prizes of \$400 each, there will be two second place awards of \$200, two third prizes of \$100 each, and 20 prizes of \$25 each.
