Movies Adventure, Intrigue Spark Movie

Three adventure films and a science fiction movie bring mid-week intrigue to State College theaters.

Gene Kelly and Italian actress Pier Angeli are teamed romantically against a background of post-war unrest in "Devil Makes Three" today and tomorrow at the Cathaum. Kelly, in one of his rare dramatic roles, plays an ex-GI who returned to Munich to find the girl who once saved him from the Germans. He finds her—caught in the web of a new underground movement to re-establish the Nazi party. Together they set out to expose the ring. Feature time is 1:57, 3:54, 5:41, 7:38, and 9:35 p.m.

At the State today only, Tony Curtis combines swordplay and romance as the handsome, swash-buckling "Son of Ali Baba." The object of his affections, Piper Laurie, co-stars as a captive princess who is forcibly hidden in the palace of Baba Senior. When what started out as persecution gets to be fun, Piper is recaptured by the evil Caliph who sent her away. Together with the Sons of the Forty Thieves, Curtis stampedes the Caliph's palace to rescue his lady fair. The technicolor production starts at 2:10, 4:04, 5:38, 7:32, and 9:45 p.m.

The follow-up is another adventure film, "Last Train from Bombay" which will be at the State tomorrow. Jon Hall stars as a young American diplomat who attempts to smash a plot for civil war and finds himself falsely accused of murder. Show time is 2:22, 4:11, 6:00, 7:49, and 9:38 p.m.

A science fiction film about a journey into the center of the earth, "Unknown World," comes to the Nittany tomorrow, beginning at 6:35, 8:08, and 9:41 p.m.

WRA, WSGA Office Nominations to Close

Nominations for Women's Student Government Association and Women's Recreation Association offices close at 5 p.m. today. Application blanks are available in the Dean of Women's office, 105 Old Main.

Two WSGA freshman senators, two WRA freshman representatives, and one WRA sophomore representative will be elected Oct. 30. Primaries are Oct. 28.

Any freshman woman is eligible to nominate herself for WSGA freshman senator or WRA freshman representative. However, if elected, she must have a 1.5 All-College average at the end of the fall semester.

Candidates to Meet
Candidates for WRA sophomore representative must be sophomores with 1.5 All-College averages and no major judicial record.

Election procedure, duties of each office, and structure of WSGA and WRA will be explained to candidates at 8:30 tonight. WSGA candidates will meet in 218 Willard and WRA in 219 Willard.

Interviews with candidates by the WSGA election board have been changed from tomorrow night to 9 a.m. Saturday. A two-thirds vote of the board is required to place a name on the ballot for primary elections. The WRA board will interview candidates tomorrow night as scheduled.

Election Board Members

The WSGA application board will consist of senior members of Senate, the present holder of the office for which the girl is applying, and students at large who are past or present members of the House of Representatives, Freshman Council, and WSGA standing or appointed committees.

Members of the WRA board will be senior members of the WRA executive board, present holder of the office being applied for, and students at large who are members of the club president's board, intramural board, social board, and WRA committees.
