Paul Anderson, 14, of State College, was injured when his bicycle and a car, driven by Benjamin Thompson, seventh semester journalism major, collided at the intersection of Locust Lane and Nittany avenue Thursday afternoon.

Anderson was on his way home from school when he was struck by Thompson's car, police reported. The left front of the car hit the bicycle, throwing the boy over the car to the ground. The windshield of Thompson's car was broken.

The bicycle rider received lacerations of the head, face, and limbs, brush burns of the elbows and knees and body bruises. He was treated by a State College physician.

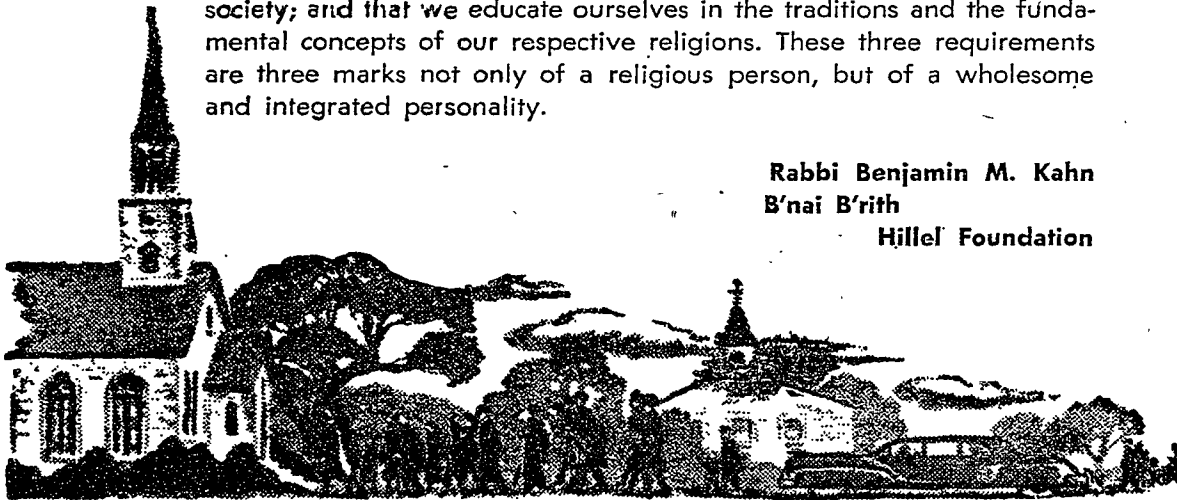
