

## Seating Plan Approved By Council

The Physical Education Student Council last night approved the Recreation Hall seating plan introduced by Ernest B. McCoy, dean of the School of Physical Education and Athletics.

The proposed seating plan would allow 300 seats to be sold to faculty members, alumni, and townspeople on a "first-come, first-serve" basis.

Reports were read to the council by Margaret Lamaster, council president, on the cost of the proposed issues of the Discobulus, the school's newsletter. The newsletter was last printed in 1948.

Definite action was tabled until the next council meeting when the complete picture, including the cost of printing and labor, could be presented. A special editorial committee, headed by co-editors Ann Barker and Kurt Klaus, will meet this week and decide the style for the Discobulus. The report will be presented to the council at the next meeting for its final approval.

Jane Whitney and Robert Keynon were named committee co-chairman of a physical education "play day" to be held in the spring. Other committee members named are Ruth Kronenwetter and Theodore Mortensen.

Dorothy Wain was elected to take the place of Barbara Benck as senior representative for the remainder of the semester. Miss Benck is student teaching.

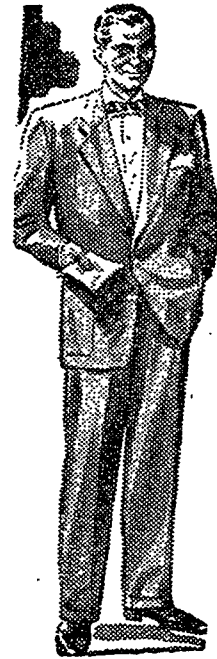

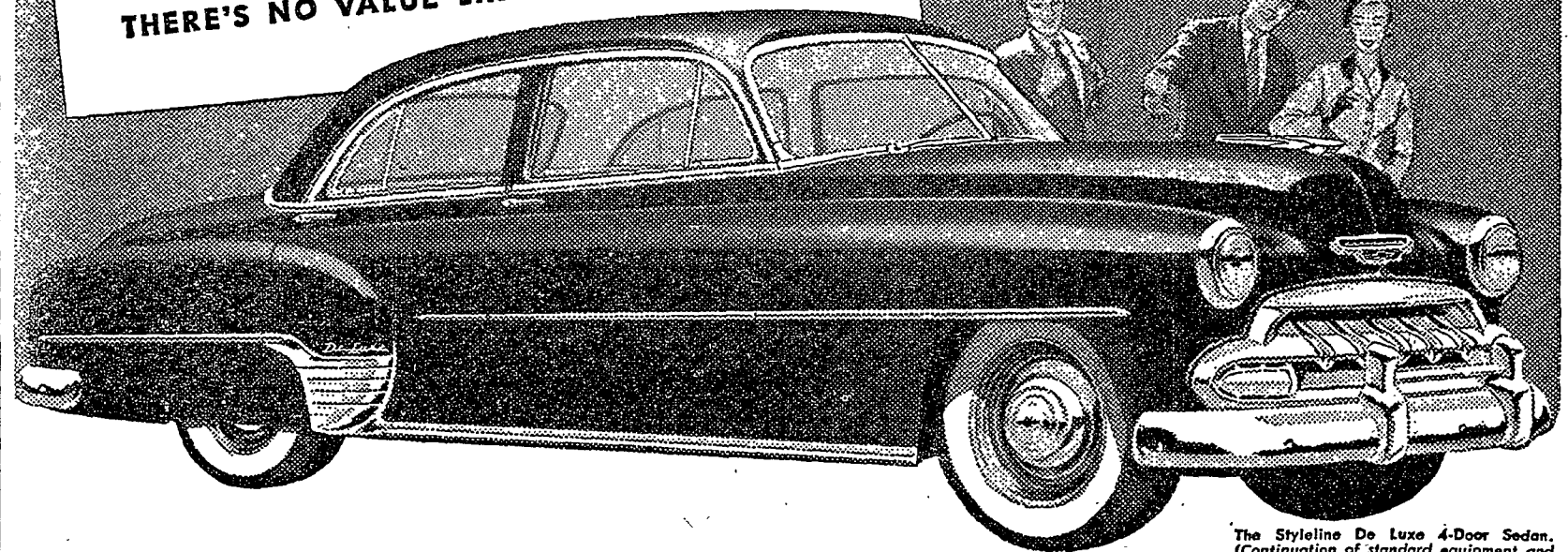
