Panel to Talk On Stopping Nazism, Fascism

"How Can the Spread of Nazism and Fascism in Europe Be Stopped?" will be discussed in the second of the Hillel Town Meetings series 8 p.m. Sunday at Hillel Foundation, 224 S. Miles street.

Robert M. Pockrass, assistant professor of journalism, will be guest moderator. Participating in the discussion will be the Rev. Luther H. Harshbarger, College chaplain; James F. Keim, associate professor of agricultural extension; and Dr. Alfred G. Pundt, European history professor and History Department head.

The three men know Europe intimately. Rabbi Benjamin M. Kahn, Hillel director, said Harshbarger served in Central Europe with the Church of the Brethren after the war and visited Europe the past summer; Keim recently returned from Western Germany where he helped set up an agricultural extension service; and Dr. Pundt was in military government in Europe following the war.
