### Ike May Get Prexy's Advice

Advice from Milton S. Eisenhower to his brother, president-elect Dwight D. Eisenhower, may be of significant importance in the period ahead, according to a report in the current U.S. News and World Report.

The magazine, appearing on newsstands today, said, "Milton Eisenhower, brother of Ike, former government official, college president, is to be far more of an influence in the period ahead than many around the new President realize. Ike's younger brother, who knows much about government, is to have ready access to the new President's ear."

President Eisenhower was recently named by his brother to a committee to study possibilities for streamlining the executive branch of the government. Two other committee members are Nelson A. Rockefeller and Dr. Arthur S. Fleming.
