## Amphitryon Will Open Thursday

S. N. Behrman's liberal translation of Jean Giraudoux's "Amphitryon 38" will be presented by Players Thursday, Friday, and Saturday of next weekend at Schwab Auditorium.

Tickets will go on sale Monday at the Student Union desk in Old Main.

H. Dennis Sherk, dramatics instructor, will direct the comedy, which was the hit of the 1937 Broadway season with Alfred Lunt and Lynn Fontaine as stars.

The Greek legend concerns King of the Gods Jupiter's courtship of the all-too-faithful Alkmene. Disguising himself with both the mental and physical aspects of Amphitryon, Alkmene's beloved husband, Jupiter wins Alkmene for one night.

Giraudoux, one of France's outstanding dramatists, called his play "Amphitryon 38" as he felt it was about the 38th rendition of the Greek legend. Brooks Atkinson, New York Times drama critic, said Behrman's liberal translation could be called "Amphitryon 39."

Jolly Oswald will be seen as Alkmene with Gordon Greer as Jupiter and John Aniston as Amphitryon. Mercury will be played by Sid Archer; Trumpeter, Dick Neuweiler; Sosie, Al Sarkas; Warrior, Bill Musser; Nenetza, Carol Strong; Kleantha, Beverly Masters; Echo, Velma Kaiser; and Leda, Alice Mears.

## Ceramics 400, Archaeological Course, Offered

Ceramics 400, a two-hour course in archaeological technology, will be offered in the spring semester for two credits by F. R. Matson, professor of ceramics.

The new course is open to students in all schools who have taken Chemistry 1 and 2.

Registrants will meet at 4:10 p.m. Feb. 3 in 225 Mineral Industries to arrange a time for the regular class meeting.

Ceramic remains are the chief archaeological materials excavated. The evidence from the technical study of these items, using the methods and facilities of modern industrial and fundamental research laboratories, will constitute the major course content.

Lectures and discussions will cover materials excavated by archaeologists, dating archaeological finds, and an analysis of archaeological materials.
