President Milton S. Eisenhower announced today the appointment of Dr. Herbert R. Albrecht. professor and head of the Department of Agronomy, as director of the Agricultural and Home Economics Extension Service.

Dr. Albrecht will assume his new post July 1. As director he will head the agency through which information pertaining to agriculture, homemaking, and rural community life and welfare is distributed and made effective throughout Pennsylvania. The staff includes agricultural and home economics extension representatives in every county of the state and specialists at the Col-lege.
