

Coed Sought in Florida

Police began a hunt in Florida yesterday for the 18-year-old Bucknell freshman coed who has not been seen since she left for Washington with her 16-year-old boyfriend last Friday, the Associated Press has reported.

The father of the girl, Jacqueline Jane Mengoni, wired police in Tallahassee, Florida, to begin a search in Florida to find his daughter. Friends of her companion, Michael O'Connell, had told police of O'Connell's desire to drive Jacqueline to Florida. O'Connell's parents also believe the couple headed towards Florida.

A 13-state alarm was sent out Wednesday when the girl failed to return to school. She signed out last Friday to go to Washington. A note to her roommate said she was going with O'Connell.

Police checked a report yesterday that a girl answering Miss Mengoni's description had stopped at a service station in Berlin, N.J.

The couple are believed to have about \$75 cash between them. Police said Miss Mengoni took only enough clothes for the week-end trip to Washington.

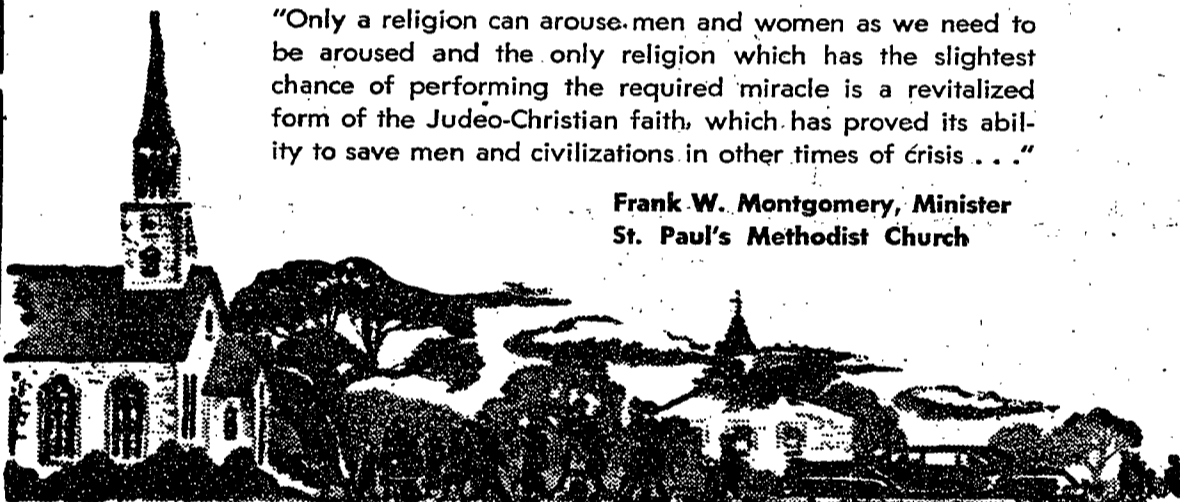


THE WAY THEY SEE IT
