

## Faculty Rating Plans Covered By LA Council

Faculty evaluation plans were considered at the Liberal Arts Student Council meeting last night. Richard Kirschner, chairman of the faculty evaluation committee, read instructions to be sent to each instructor in the Liberal Arts school and the evaluation sheet to be filled out by the students at the discretion of the instructor.

The basis of the evaluation is to determine the quality of instruction, intellectual stimulation, examinations, book content, lectures, attitude and originality of the instructor, and other personal classroom habits.

Eliza Newell, sixth semester journalism major, was elected to the position of secretary-treasurer to replace Marion Morgan Houston, who has left campus.

A discussion was held on the final examination leak and suggestions were made for future elimination of the situation.

With the advent of World War II, all amateur operations were again suspended but the station was kept in readiness for immediate service if needed by the Army.

In 1946, the Army in cooperation with the Safe Harbor Power Co. organized the Susquehanna Emergency Net to assist the weather bureau in flood emergencies and to maintain flood control. The College station is an active participant in this net and sends weather reports obtained from the College weather station to Safe Harbor in southeastern Pennsylvania. This information is used with information obtained from other stations in the net to predict rain stages and possible floods.

Early in 1947, the chief signal office of the Army and the Norwegian Embassy in Washington

requested the College station to serve as the official contact between the United States and the famed "Kon Tiki" expedition. All official government and Norwegian embassy traffic, as well as messages between the explorers and their families in Norway, was handled through the station.

Since the expedition was restricted by the government, the College station received no general publicity for its contribution to the expedition, and in the book

and the movie "Kon Tiki" no mention is made of the service rendered by the station.

At the present time, the station is directing Centre County civil defense and is responsible for all radio communications for emergency use in Centre County. The station also serves as contact station for Centre County in the state wide Civilian Defense network and is one of the chief stations in the military amateur radio system.

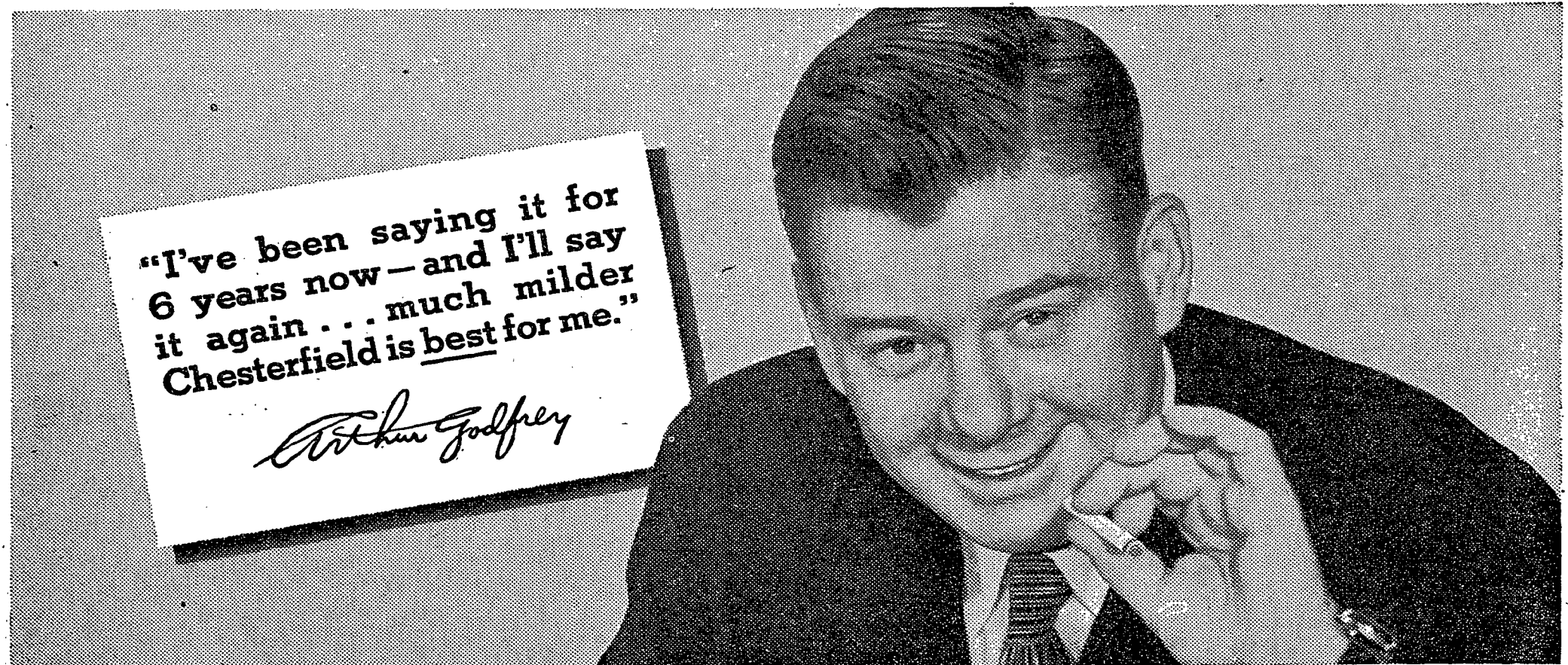

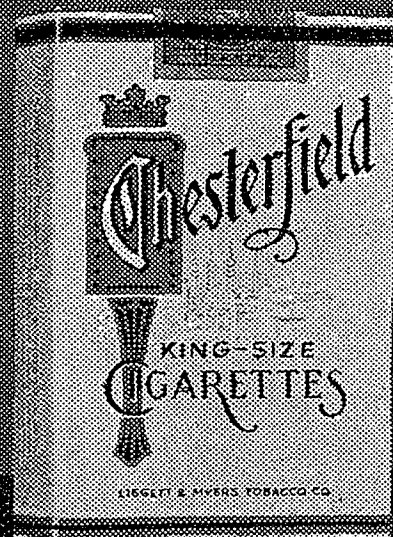
