

Prof to Talk on Japan At ICSF Worship Service

Dr. Rose M. Cologne, associate professor of speech education, will speak and show slides on her experiences in Japan at the inter-Protestant worship service, sponsored by the Interchurch Student Fellowship, at 6:45 p.m. tomorrow in the Westminster Foundation.

The offering from this service will go toward a \$250 scholarship fund for the International Christian University located 17 miles from Tokyo, Japan. If ICSF can raise \$250 for a scholarship which would bear the name of the College, the ICU foundation will send the College a Japanese cherry tree which would be planted in the vicinity of Simmons and McElwain halls.

Dr. Cologne made two trips to Japan, one from 1948 to 1949 and one from 1950 to 1951. During this time, she trained leaders for the adult education program which will be established in the uni-

versity. Many of the leaders which she trained head the Citizens Public Halls which have been established in Japan.

The program of ICU calls for the establishment of graduate schools of education, citizenship, public affairs, and social work, in addition to an undergraduate college of liberal arts.

Although its broad purpose is to establish a university based on the common values of Christianity and democratic philosophy, the university intends specifically to prepare new leaders for a new Japan.

UJA Solicitors To Start Drive

Dormitory solicitors will begin the 1953 United Jewish Appeal campaign at a kickoff meeting at 3 p.m. tomorrow at the Hillel Foundation, 224 S. Miles street.

Aaron Druckman, professor of philosophy, will speak on UJA in Simmons Hall lounge at 6:20 p.m. Monday. Speakers will also explain the campaign at the Jewish fraternity houses.

The money from the UJA campaign will aid in the relief and rehabilitation of 2½ million Jews behind the Iron Curtain, over 100,000 Jews in Moslem lands, and 750,000 homeless Jews in Israel. Because of the recent anti-Semitism in the Soviet Union and satellites the national goal has been set at \$14,524,250.

Joseph Banks and Nedra Levine will head the drive for Hillel this year. The local goal has been set for \$4200.

The campaign will end next Saturday with the annual Purim Carnival.

WSGA, WRA Primaries Set For Tuesday

Canterbury Club

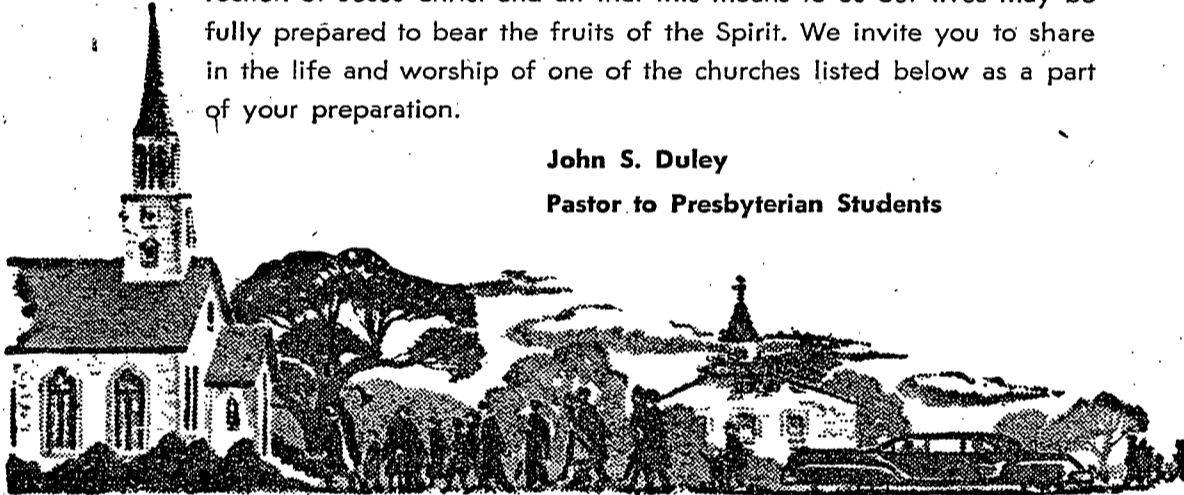
