

### Steidle Invited To Lecture In California

Dr. Edward Steidle, dean of the School of Mineral Industries, has been invited to be a visiting lecturer at the University of California for one month beginning Monday.

While in California, Steidle will participate in the inauguration of Chancellor Clark Kerr March 21. He will also take part in Charter Day activities including the Charter Day banquet during the period of March 21-23.

Plans are being made for Steidle to meet with various alumni committees and mineral industries groups. He will also address the San Francisco section of the American Institute of Mining and Metallurgical Engineers.

Steidle expects to spend the first three weeks on the campus of the University at Berkeley and the last week on the Los Angeles campus.

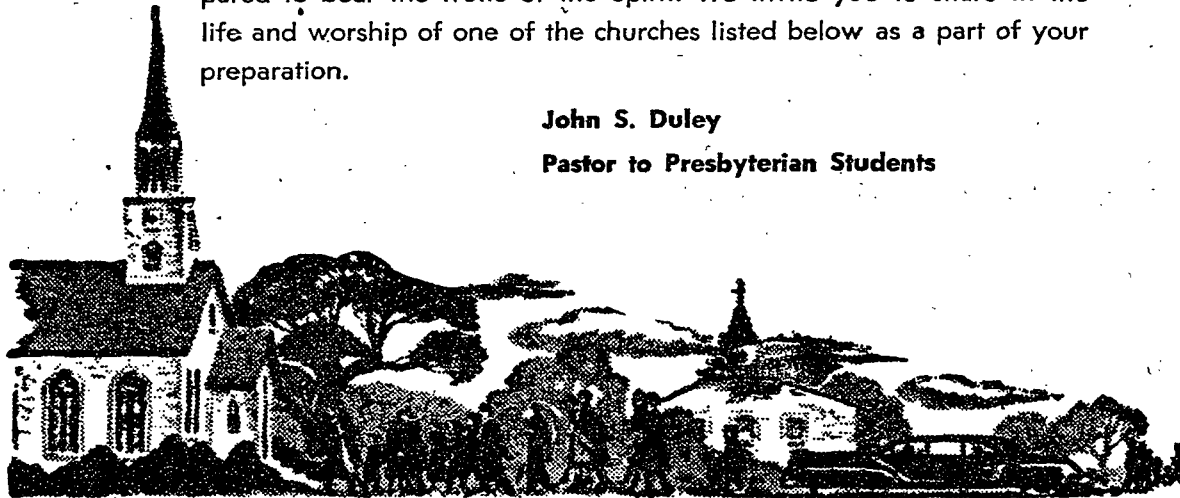
