

Piano Concert To Be Given Monday Night

Iren Marik, Hungarian-born pianist, will present a concert at 8:15 p.m. Monday in Schwab Auditorium. The concert is sponsored by the Association of American Colleges and the Department of Music and is open to the public without charge.

Miss Marik will conduct a master class for students of the State College schools and students at the College from 9 to 11 a.m. Tuesday. The class will be held in Schwab Auditorium and will be open to the public.

Miss Marik is a graduate of the Franz Liszt Academy of Music in Budapest. After a series of recitals in Europe she launched her American career with a concert at New York's Town Hall.

She is now on the faculty of Sweet Briar College and is combining her profession of concert pianist with that of a music teacher. Miss Marik says her aim is to give her students a basic, simple knowledge of piano technique on which they can further build, if they wish to continue their studies.

by Cabinet. The recommendation, presented by Interscholastic Council Board President Lincoln Warrell, would provide for equal student council assessments.

At present, the Agriculture and Home Economics student councils have fees of 75 and 25 cents each. If a general and equal council fee existed, the College could collect fees at registration each semester.

Watson Opposes Plan

A second part of the ISCB plan would distribute the money collected to each school council on the basis of the number of students in the school. When ISCB also suggested the West Dormitory 50-cent-a semester social fee be collected when a student living in the area paid for his room key.

Robert Watson, president of the Engineering Student Council, said his council probably would not use the \$880 that would come to the council each year under this plan. It was suggested by other members of cabinet that the 25 cent fee be subtracted from engineer's subscriptions to the Penn State Engineer or that scholarships in the Engineering school be set up.

Warrell said the board based these suggestions on the need of student councils for more money. He read a letter from the administration stating the additional 50 cents of the present 75 cent Agricultural fee would not be compulsory. The College would, however, set up a place for additional money to be collected, the letter said.

administration and not by the university.

Murphy defended NSA's stand that student groups should not be prohibited from campuses according to their political beliefs, provided also that these student groups obey student and college laws and regulations, and so long as these groups confine their ideas to "freedom of speech and thought—not action."

The attacks, which Murphy referred to, were started by an organization known as Students for America, formerly known as Students against MacArthur. The charges against NSA were published in the American Student, newspaper of Students for America, and picked up by such news commentators as Fulton Lewis Jr. and Walter Winchell.
