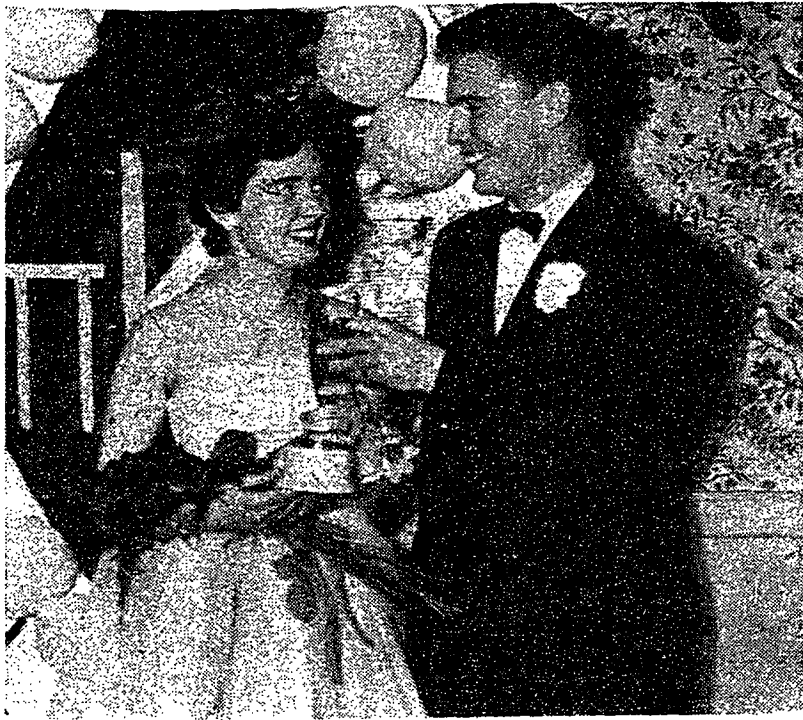


## Dream Girl of PiKA

## PSCA Plans Three Series Of Lectures

Tentative plans have been made by the Penn State Christian Association for three series of lectures to be held during the 1953-54 school year.

Dr. Paul Lenman, professor of Christian ethics at Princeton University, will speak on the "Theological Basis of Social Action" in October.

In December, Dr. Leila Anderson, executive of the national student YWCA, will lecture, and Dr. Robert L. Cahoun, professor of historical philosophy and theology at Yale University, will speak at the College in the spring.

Plans have also been started on an International Dinner for American and foreign students, a colloquy on religion and politics, and a tour of the United Nations to be held during the fall semester.

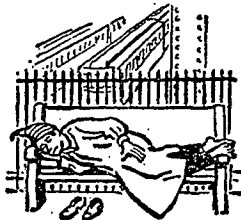
### Women's Lacrosse

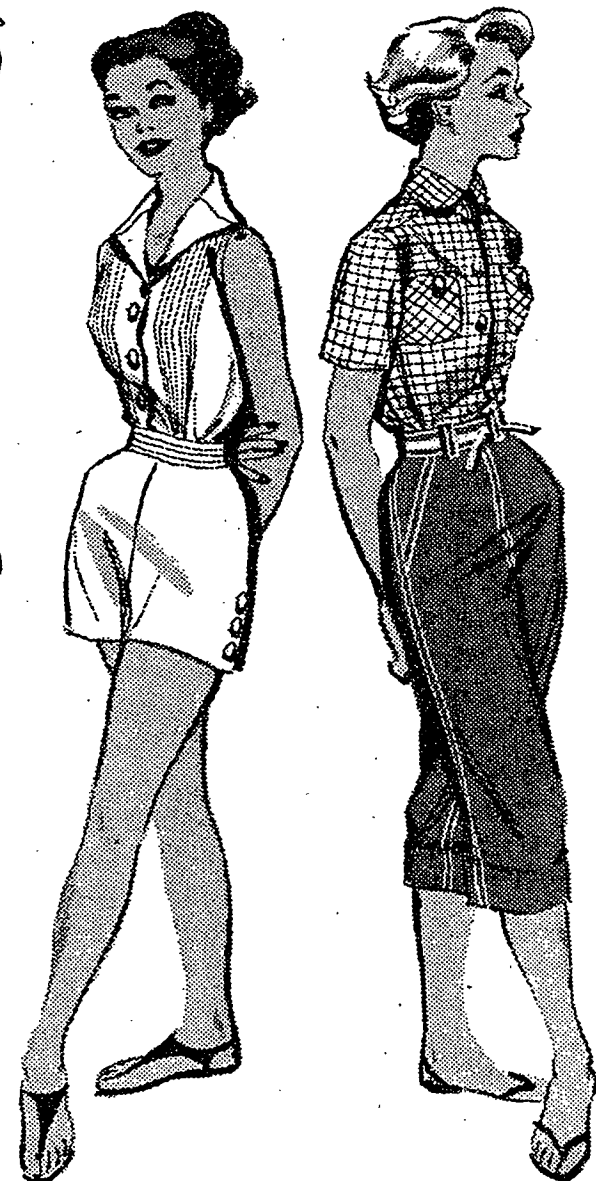
