

Poe Is Topic Of Yale Prof

Dr. Carl F. Schreiber, of Yale University, will speak on "Mr. Poe Gets Up Books" in the fifth Simmons lecture series at 4:15 p.m. Monday in 121 Sparks.

Dr. Schreiber is professor of German language and literature and head of the German department at Yale. He has published books and articles dealing with Goethe, Poe, and German romance.

He is curator of the Speck Collection of Goetheana and has published the first of a four-volume catalogue about the collection on Goethe.

Moscow trip, which was part of a 22,000 mile tour through 14 countries, stirred up a hubbub in the American press. Time accused them of writing about Moscow "as if they had never seen a big city."

All three editors pointed out that on the basis of only seven days, no ability to speak the language, and the limited area of Russia they were allowed to see, they could not have any idea on possible Russian policy or opinion. They could only report, they said, what they observed, as accurately as they could. For that, Simon said, they were accused of being apologists for Russia.

Simon defended the "rosy" reports of Moscow life on the grounds that a newspaperman must be accurate and objective no matter what the preconceptions of his material might be.

Matson to Discuss College "Academic Man"

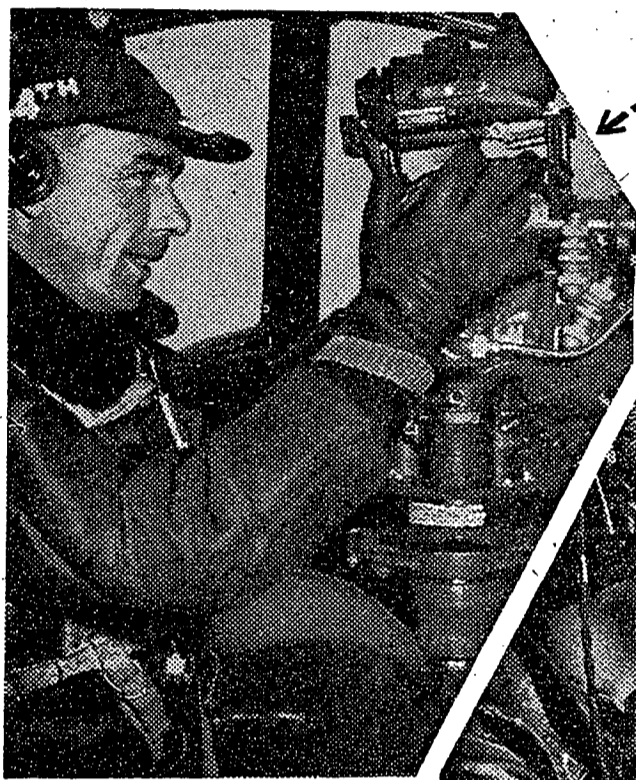
