Army and Air Force cadets must serve two years in basic classes, with two years of advanced training optional to students chemical engineering by paying members from all schools. Receive Pay

A contract cadet may be pro-moted to regular cadet by examination after the program gets underway.

Naval contract cadets, like Army and Air Force cadets receive 90 cents a day subsistance pay for senior years, plus extra pay for summer duty. Regular Naval students receive a monthly tuition and books for all four years at the College.

Naval cadets must take three summer cruises before they are graduated. Army and Air Force cadets must take a four to six week training period between their junior and senior years.

Upon graduation, naval regu-lars become ensigns in the U.S. Navy, while contract men become ensigns in the naval reserve. Army and Air Force advanced ca-dets become second lieutenants in their reserve organizations.


