A charge, stating that Sinclair was guilty of "unscrupulous conduct detrimental to the good name and intentions of the Lion
Party," was presented at the meeting. Sinclair, who refused to attend the meeting on grounds that it was illegal, denied the charge. No action was taken on the charge by the group.
