COME TO CHURCH

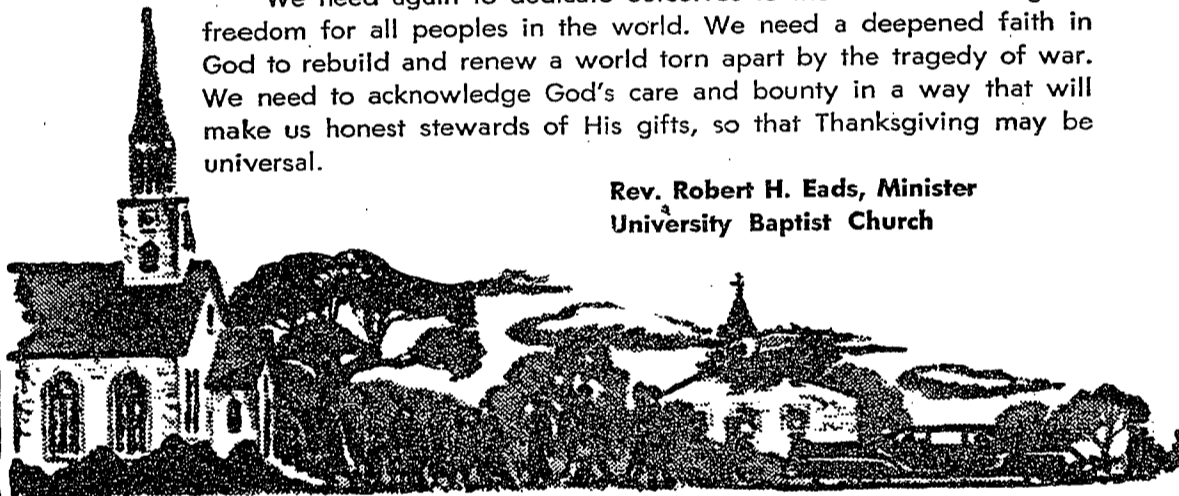
