

### Matson to Talk On Ceramics

Dr. Frederick R. Matson, professor of archaeology, will present the Sigma Xi lecture at 8 p.m. Thursday in 119 Osmond.

He will discuss "Archaeology and the Ceramic Laboratory—the Technical Study of Ancient Materials."

Dr. Matson in 1944 was named head of the glass section of the Armstrong Cork Co. research laboratories in Lancaster and in 1948 was appointed to the University faculty as professor of ceramics. He was appointed professor of archaeology last July.

Dr. Matson has done archaeological field work in Iraq and the eastern United States. His interests are primarily in the technical study of archaeological materials, such as pottery, glass metals, pigments, plaster, and stone.

sity, Harold K. Schilling, committee chairman, said.

Questions which the Senate committee raised in its preliminary report to Senate included:

1. Is there a need for a bureau of educational research and evaluation?

2. Are present student personnel services adequate?

3. Are we doing enough for the superior student?

4. Is the work of the University in close enough cooperation with the secondary school system of the state?

5. Are we giving prospective college teachers the kind of preparation they need?

The final report of the committee is expected to include specific suggestions for action, Schilling, said. After extensive consultation among the faculty and a number of revisions of the written report, a final report should be ready by next year, he said.
