The Virginia boxing match was originally one of three home contests for the Nittany boxing squad. The Lions will be hosts to Michigan State, in the season opener Jan. 30, and to Syracuse two weeks later,

Harold R. Gilbert, assistant director of athletics, said a series of cancelations left Virginia with only one home meet and Cavalier officials asked for the change to build interest in the Eastern title tournament slated for Charlottesville in March.

Gilbert pointed out that the change will detract from the home schedule in 1954 but improve the centennial slate in 1955. The Cavaliers readily agreed to the latter switch.
